School Stream

At Thornleigh West there are many ways we communicate information and share successes with the community.

The school stream app gives us the ability to send out urgent messages, changes to expected plans or reminders for upcoming events.

iPhone / iPad iOS

- From your mobile device go to the App Store search for School Stream
- 2. Tap the **FREE/GET** button to the right of the School Stream listing
- 3. Tap the **INSTALL** button
- 4. Enter your Apple ID and password & tap OK
- 5. Wait for the install icon to change to **OPEN**
- 6. Tap the **OPEN** button
- You will be prompted to accept push notifications, you will need to select OK
- 8. Start typing **your school** into the search then **SELECT your school**

Android / Tablet

- From your mobile device go to the Play Store search for School Stream
- 2. Tap the School Stream listing
- 3. Tap the INSTALL button
- 4. Tap the ACCEPT button
- Wait for the app to install then tap the OPEN button
- Start typing your school into the search then SELECT your school
- 7. Tap the DONE button in the top left

Health Care

School Photos

School photos will be held on **Tuesday 26 February**. Order envelopes have been sent home and need to be **returned on photo day only please**. The photographer's instructions also indicate that an **envelope** needs to be **returned separately for each child**, **but only if not ordering online** (in that case an envelope does not need to be returned at all, please see envelope for instructions). **Family photos** will also be taken and **order envelopes for those are available from the office** on request.

Group photos will include school captains and prefects, sports captains and vice-captains, a complimentary Year 6 group photo and photos of each of our school bands. Could band students please bring their instrument on the day. The group photos will be available for viewing online after the photo day and orders can then be made directly online (no envelope required). The complementary Year 6 group photo will be given to Year 6 students at the end of the year as part of their graduation package.

Please ensure your child is wearing their **formal school uniform** on the day. Photos will be taken of all the children whether they have returned an envelope or not. This allows for late orders if applicable. Please note that the purchase of photos is not obligatory and is optional.





Car park Safety

Could I please remind the community that student safety is paramount. We understand the main access gate on Giblett Ave is busy both before and after school. However, students and families are reminded and encouraged to use the path and front gate ONLY, and not use the carpark as a way to enter or leave the school. This term students are learning about road safety and it would be powerful to reinforce these messages at home.

Hold my hand every time we cross the road

A note for my family,

My class is learning more about road safety and crossing the road. Because I am young please:

- · hold my hand whenever cars are or could be about
- talk with me about how to cross the road safely every time we cross
- · practise crossing the road safely with me
- practise crossing at pedestrian crossings and at pedestrian lights.

Some things to talk about and practise:

- · holding hands every time we cross the road
- if you can't hold my hand, making sure I hold your arm, clothes, bag or the pram or trolley.

When we cross the road talk with me about:

- · looking for pedestrian signs and lights or other safer options
- stopping one step back from the kerb
- · always stopping completely
- · what we need to look and listen for
- how long we need to look and listen for
- what could stop us or make it difficult for us to look or listen
- waiting for vehicles to stop before stepping on to the road at crossings
- · why we think it's safe to cross
- · when it's safe to cross, walking straight across the road and checking for vehicles as we go.

At pedestrian traffic lights talk with me about:

- · the red and green pedestrian signals and what these mean
- stopping one step back from the kerb when the red pedestrian signal is showing
- pressing the button and waiting for the green pedestrian signal to appear
- only ever starting to walk across the road when the green pedestrian signal is showing
- understanding that cars are supposed to stop when the green pedestrian signal appears but sometimes they might not.

TWPS Prayer Group News


Please join us as we pray for TWPS and our community. All are welcome—especially new friends. We meet on Tuesdays at 9am, at the canteen steps.


