Stewart house, Earn and learn, Return and earn



We have been overwhelmed with generosity this term as donations flooded in for Stewart House. The collection was picked up late last week by very appreciative volunteers.

About Stewart House: Every year 1,700 public school children attend our safe haven next to Curl Curl beach at no cost to their parents or carers. During a 12-day stay, they are provided with dental, optical, hearing and medical screening and treatment.

Children participate in educational programs and excursions designed to develop their social and emotional skills, build self-esteem and improve their overall wellbeing. This experience provides children with a muchneeded break from their current circumstance. Our children are inspired to see beyond the present and to have real hope and positive aspirations for their future.

The children at Thornleigh West have been working hard to make sure all bottles are collected and recycled through our Return and Earn Program. Last week our recycling was collected and the school earned \$59.20 bringing our total to \$204.50 and saving 2046 bottles from landfill.





Thank you for the hundreds and more likely thousands of earn and learn stickers that you have returned to either the school or store collection boxes.

These go a long way to providing valuable resources for the classroom and playground.
