Senior Choir

Another fabulous occasion which saw our children afforded a special life experience, was the performance of the Senior School Choir who sang at the Opera House last week. As we would expect, they behaved exceptionally well and, sitting in the prime position at the front of the stage where all could clearly see, sang beautifully. We are lucky at our school to have teachers who are willing to take on this type of extra curricula activity. There is a lengthy process to go through to be accepted into these Departmental concerts. It begins with providing the Arts Unit with an audition tape of the choir. They are then rated on the basis of their overall sound, balance of harmonies, 'choir behaviours' such as stance and ability to watch and follow the conductor. On acceptance into the program of concerts, teachers attend workshops and training about the set repertoire and organisational procedures, both inside and outside of their working hours. The organisation in school to get the children to external rehearsals and to maintain weekly rehearsals in lunchtimes, is an additional task for these teachers who happily participate knowing what a great opportunity it is for the children. We thank Ms Dowd who takes Senior choir for her work and Miss Loke for spending the whole day and evening to assist.
