Tell The From Me – Parent Survey!

This Term, our school will be participating in the *Partners in Learning* parent survey, another part of the *Tell Them From Me* suite of surveys (student, teacher and parent surveys) on student engagement. The survey asks parents and carers questions about different factors that are known to impact on student wellbeing and engagement.

Running this survey will help our school understand parents' and carers' perspectives on their child's experience at school. These include: communication between parents/carers and staff, activities and practices at home and parent/carer views on the school's support of learning and behaviour. This valuable feedback will help our school make practical improvements.

The survey is conducted entirely online on smartphones, iPads, tablets, laptops or computers. The survey will typically take 15 minutes or less to complete and is completely confidential. BUSHFIRE EMERGENCY PROCEDURES

The Westleigh Area is renowned for its high bushfire threat. The staff at Thornleigh West Public School, in consultation with our local Emergency Services, are compiling a comprehensive Bushfire Plan for our school in the event of a bushfire emergency. Procedures are in place to deal, safely and confidently, with a fire burning in the local district or impacting on our school site. This statement is an outline of our school plan. If you wish to view our full School Plan, please see the front office. There are some clear instructions for families in this document.

Please read it carefully. In many situations it is better that you **DO NOT** collect your child from school as driving on roads may be dangerous to you and to Emergency Services.

Our school has been flagged as "high risk" of a bushfire directly impacting on our school; along with a high risk of embers and smoke impacting us in certain weather conditions.

RELEASE OF CHILDREN

On days of Extreme Bush Fire Danger, parents/guardians or authorised adults may collect children from school at any time during the day by signing them out at the front office.

We will not release children at the end of school day if we know a fire is burning in or threatening the district unless parents or authorised adults come for the children. If you arrive at school and find the situation has worsened, you will be better to stay safe in our designated "Shelter in Place", the school Hall.

Children **will NOT** be dismissed to other parents on a telephone call request. We will only release children to parents/guardians or those adults authorised as Emergency Contacts. It is imperative that you keep your Emergency Contacts up to date. This must be done in writing – no telephone message will be taken as authority.

PROCEDURES

Children will remain in their classrooms whilst it is safe to do so.

- In the case of a fire actually threatening, the school children will move to our designated "Shelter in Place", the school Hall and remain in there until the fire has completely passed or unless otherwise advised.
- The Emergency Response Team, consisting of the Principal, Deputy Principal, Assistant Principals, Chief Fire Wardens and First Aid Officer are in control at all times.



BUSHFIRE PROCEDURES. (Teachers will keep a copy in their Duty Bags)

We have broken down our Bushfire Procedures into four stages:-

- Total Fire Ban Days.
- Fire Reported in Local District.
- Fire in the immediate vicinity or impacting on the site; and
- Recovery.

Teachers will discuss these four stages with their children early in Terms 1 and 4 each year.

TOTAL FIRE BAN DAY

School Action:

Teachers will mark and check their Rolls carefully and make a note of any child signed in/out of school early/late, taking particular care to know where all class members are during the day.



- Discuss the Bushfire Drill with the students.
- ♦ Reconsider any excursions.

Family Action:

♦ Listen to local media reports and await advice from the School on School Stream app and/or messages.

FIRE REPORTED IN OUR LOCAL DISTRICT

School Action:

- ♦ The Emergency Kit is to be placed in the Hall by Administration staff.
- Children in spaces other than their classroom will return to their classroom for supervision by the classroom teacher.
- ♦ Class Teachers will check the roll.
- ♦ Class Teachers will discuss with their children the Level of Alert and route to the Hall if it is necessary.
- ♦ Teachers will have Class Rolls ready.
- ♦ No child is to be released unless to a parent or a person nominated as an Emergency Contact.

Family Action:

- Listen to local radio and media for bushfire updates that may start to designate local areas and streets and await advice from the School on School Stream app and/or messages.
- ◆ Decide to collect children if safe (children will only be signed out to nominated Emergency Contacts)
- ♦ If smoke and embers have caused the closure of some roads DO NOT leave home the children will be safe at school.

FIRE IN IMMEDIATE VICINITY OR IMPACTING ON SITE

School Action:

- All students, staff and visitors will move to the Hall on hearing the siren or being informed personally by the Principal or in the event of his/her absence, the Deputy Principal.
- The Principal will ensure all persons are accounted for and in the Hall.
- Classroom teachers will do a roll call of students in their care.
- Front Office staff will monitor phones and parents arriving at school.
- All persons sheltering in the Hall will prepare for arrival and passage of the fire front.

The Emergency Response Team will:-

- Ensure all persons are located away from windows and unnecessary movement is limited;
- Provide regular updates at an appropriate level to students and adults;
- Safely observe the situation outside the building and relay this information back to all persons in the Hall;
- Assist all students and adults to remain calm; and
- Outline possible plans of action with the staff and students, after the front has passed.

Any other adults on the property are to report to the Principal for instructions.

Hall will be sealed off as best as possible to prevent smoke inhalation.

All persons will be given face shields and bottled water to prevent smoke inhalation.

Ensure that windows are closed tightly.

Stay in Hall until fire front passes even if roof and window frames are alight.

The Emergency Response Team will signal when it is safe to leave the Hall.

Family Action:

Listen to local radio and media for bushfire updates that may start to designate local areas and streets and await advice from the school.



RECOVERY STAGE

School Action:

- Staff will remain with the students at all times and will account for their safety.
- Class teachers will mark students off the roll as they are collected.
- Small spot fires will be extinguished by an able staff member.
- The Emergency Response Team will determine when people should leave the Hall.
- Principal to give decision on how to evacuate staff and students determining safety always.

Family Action:

- Listen to local radio and media updates to determine when it is safe to come to school to collect your children. Instructions will be given to parents via our school's official Facebook page.
- DO NOT travel on roads unless they are safe the children are safe at school.
- When you come to collect your children, please bear in mind that parents will all be arriving at once to collect their children as quickly as possible and emotions will be high. Please be respectful of others.

Band News



My child is thinking of joining the band. When do they rehearse? Training Band rehearses once per week on Tuesday mornings 7:45-8:45am. Each student will also require a 30 min tutor session per week. Tutors can be recommended via the website.

Band is open to all Year 2 and interested students from Years 3-5. Choosing your instrument preference is a fun time. All Year 2 students enjoy the try-out morning and learning about the instruments. Whether your child is wanting to join the band or not, it is a great hands-on lesson. If joining the band, each child will be able to nominate 3 instruments as their preferred choice. The band director and conveners will then decide on instrument allocation according to preference, physical ability and the balance of the band.

Further information will be provided next term and at the information evening.

What instruments are included in a concert band at TWPS and are available to hire?

Woodwind instruments – Flute, Clarinet, Alto / Tenor Saxophone.

Brass Instruments – Trumpets, Trombone, French Horn, Euphonium, Baritone Horn, Tuba.

Bass Instruments – Bass Guitar, Keyboard.

Percussion (Glock only provided for home use) – Mallets (Glockenspiel, Xylophone), Snare Drum, Bass Drum, Tuned Percussion (Timpani), Auxiliary Percussion (triangles, shakers, whistles, wood block etc)

*The above instruments can be hired from the school. Other instruments can join the band, however will need to be discussed with the Committee and Band Director Mr David Bell.
