Years 3 and 5 NAPLAN

Years 3 and 5 NAPLAN results will come home on Friday of this week.

In the National Assessment Program, the results across the Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 literacy and numeracy assessments are reported on a scale from Band 1 to Band 10. The achievement scale represents increasing levels of skills and understandings demonstrated in these assessments.

Ongoing formative assessments and/or classroom observations are also used to track student learning. Teachers use this data to change their teaching and move learning forward. If you would like to discuss your child's results please make an appointment with the classroom teacher.

Tell The From Me – Parent Survey!

This Term, our school will participate in the *Partners in Learning* parent survey, another part of the *Tell Them From Me* suite of surveys (student, teacher and parent surveys) on student engagement. The survey asks parents and carers questions about different factors that are known to impact on student wellbeing and engagement.



Running this survey will help our school understand parents' and carers' perspectives on their child's experience at school. These include: communication between parents/carers and staff, activities and practices at home, parent/carer views on the school's support of learning and behaviour and the written reports about children's learning that is sent home twice a year. This valuable feedback will help our school make practical improvements.

The survey is conducted entirely online on smartphones, iPads, tablets, laptops or computers. The survey will typically take 15 minutes or less to complete and is completely confidential. The parent survey will be conducted between 26 August and 25 October. Participating in the survey is entirely voluntary, your responses are very much appreciated.

Social Media



A challenge for parents in today's world is monitoring the use of social media. Most platforms, including snapchat, instagram, and the new TikTok, have rules where under 13 year olds are not allowed to have access to them. These rules are there for a reason. All too often children are hurt because friends have made inappropriate posts, and arguments from the day can continue into the night and into the homespace. I understand the pressure children place on their parents to allow them to be involved in social media; they don't want to look like the odd one out and the platforms are specifically designed to be highly desirable and addictive. If all parents stand together and help their children to understand why they are not to have accounts for these sites, it would make it easier for families to make their experiences with social media safe and enjoyable. It takes a community to raise a child, and the Westleigh/Thornleigh community is a great one, supportive and caring. Show your care for your children by limiting their private access to social media sites and help them to navigate this new world wisely.

If joining the band, each child will be able to nominate 3 instruments as their preferred choice. The band director and conveners will then decide on instrument allocation according to preference, physical ability and the balance of the band. Woodwind instruments – Flute, Clarinet, Alto / Tenor Saxophone.

Brass Instruments – Trumpets, Trombone, French Horn, Euphonium, Baritone Horn, Tuba. Bass Instruments – Bass Guitar, Keyboard.

Percussion (Glock only provided for home use) – Mallets (Glockenspiel, Xylophone), Snare Drum, Bass Drum, Tuned Percussion (Timpani), Auxiliary Percussion (triangles, shakers, whistles, wood block etc)

*The above instruments can be hired from the school. Other instruments can join the band, however will need to be discussed with the Committee and Band Director Mr David Bell.
