It is this time of the year to remind everyone of road safety around the school. Our students are precious and I urge everyone to slow down and follow the road rules especially during school zones.

Parking and traffic rules in school zones


You need to take extra care when driving and parking in school zones. Make sure that you and your child understand the road rules. If you break the traffic rules in a school zone you are putting not only your child but other children at risk. The parking and traffic rules around our schools are there to protect your children. If you break the rules you will be fined. Please choose safety over convenience.

QUICK REFERENCE GUIDE TO IMPORTANT SAFETY TRAFFIC RULES				
ZONE	WHAT DOES IT MEAN?	WHY IS IT THERE?	PENALTY	DEMERIT POINTS
NO STOPPING	You cannot stop in a NO STOPPING zone for any reason (including queuing or waiting for a space).	Keeps clear sight lines between drivers and children / pedestrians.	\$344	(School Zone)
₽	You can stop in a NO PARKING zone for a max, of two minutes to drop off and pick up passengers. If no spaces are available you cannot queue on the road way or in any other zones while vesting for a space. You will need to drive away and park elsewhere, only returning when there is space to pull up. You must stay within 3 metres of your vehicle at all times and cannot leave your vehicle unattended.	Provides a safe place for children / pedestrian set down and pick up.	\$191	(School Zone)
BUS	You must not stop or park in a BUS ZONE for any reason (including queuing or waiting for a space) unless you are driving a bus. If times are shown on the sign, you are not allowed to stop during those times.	Provides a safe place for large buses to set down and pick up school children.	\$344	(School Zone)
(You must not stop on or within 20 metres before a PEDESTRIAN CROSSING or 10 metres after a crossing unless there is a control sign permitting parking.	So drivers can clearly see pedestrians on the crossing.	\$457	(School Zone)
(m) (m)	DOUBLE PARKING You must not stop on the road adjacent to another vehicle at any time even to drop off or pick up passengers.	Double parking blocks visibility and forces other cars to go around you.	\$344 (S)	(School Zone)
¥	You must not stop on any FOOTPATH or NATURE STRIP, or even a DRIVEWAY crossing a footpath or nature strip for any reason.	You could easily run over a child or force pedestrians onto the road to get around you.	\$344	(School Zone)

Parking Rules


Please park safely and legally on the streets around your school. Park legally so you do not incur parking fines and demerit points. Council's Traffic Compliance Officers enforce parking around schools. If you park contrary to the road rules you will be fined!

You cannot stop or park your vehicle:



Parallel parking

This is the usual way to park unless signs tell you otherwise. You must park in the same direction as the adjacent traffic and parallel and as close as possible to the kerb.

The school stream app gives us the ability to send out urgent messages, changes to expected plans or reminders for upcoming events.

iPhone / iPad iOS

- From your mobile device go to the App Store search for School Stream
- 2. Tap the **FREE/GET** button to the right of the School Stream listing
- 3. Tap the **INSTALL** button
- 4. Enter your Apple ID and password δ tap **OK**
- 5. Wait for the install icon to change to OPEN
- 6. Tap the **OPEN** button
- 7. You will be prompted to accept push notifications, you will need to select **OK**
- 8. Start typing **your school** into the search then **SELECT your school**

- 7. Tap the **DONE** button in the top left

Note: Some devices may vary please follow your usual installation procedure for downloading and installing an app to your device.




Emergency Contacts

From time to time there are occasions where we need to be in contact to support a student through a first aid or other incident. Car Park Safety

Could I please remind the community that student safety is paramount. We understand the main access gate on Giblett Ave is busy both before and after school. However, students and families are reminded and encouraged to use the path and front gate ONLY, and not use the carpark as a way to enter of leave the school. This term students are learning about road safety and it would be powerful to reinforce these messages at home.

Health Care





As a part of our annual review of health care plans we are required to update all information for allergic reactions and anaphylaxis. It is mandatory to update plans yearly.

If required, you will receive action plans which are printed in colour. Could you please complete for your child with your medical practitioner and return to your class teacher at your convenience. Please ensure contact names and phone numbers are included and accurate.

In addition, could please make an appointment with your class teacher to discuss the requirements of the school and the procedures the school needs to follow to ensure the safety and welfare of your child.

School Photo day—Change of date

School photo day has changed and will now be held on **Monday 2 March**.

Order envelopes were sent home last week and need to be **returned on photo day only please**. The photographer's instructions also indicate that an **envelope** needs to be **returned separately for each child**, **but only if not ordering online** (in that case an envelope does not need to be returned at all, please see envelope for instructions). **Family photos** will also be taken and **order envelopes for those are available from the office** on request. Replacement envelopes will be available from the office if needed for the day.

Group photos will include school captains and prefects, sports captains and vice-captains, a complimentary Year 6 group photo and photos of each of our school bands. Could band students please bring their instrument on the day. The group photos will be available for viewing online after the photo day and orders can then be made directly online (no envelope required). The complementary Year 6 group photo will be given to Year 6 students at the end of the year as part of their graduation package.

Please ensure your child is wearing their **formal summer school uniform** on the day.

Photos will be taken of all the children whether they have returned an envelope or not. This allows for late orders if applicable. Please note that the purchase of photos is not obligatory and is optional.




