This week's update

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

I would like to thank you for your ongoing support in this time of challenge. Please be assured that I am doing everything possible to keep children and staff healthy and safe.

The NSW Health and NSW Education have advised the following:

- There is no evidence of school-based COVID-19 outbreaks in Australia and community transmission is limited.
- The rate of infection of children is between 0.9 and 1.2% of cases which is the lowest level of infection of all Australians.
- There is no evidence to suggest proactive school closures limit social contact especially in high school students.
- There is evidence to suggest that proactive school closures are potentially more harmful than good as children interact with the broader population.
- Reactive school closures are effective for outbreak response.
- Schools are asked to promote precautionary measures, to postpone camps and group events such as assemblies.

Thornleigh West Public School is following the advice of experts and will continue to provide learning at school. This, however, is a rapidly evolving situation and I will follow any updated health and medical advice of the government.

Should a student or member staff be tested as positive for COVID-19, the school will follow the directives of the Health Department.

The experience of schools in Sydney to date has demonstrated that this will mean the school will be closed for a short time. Students will be able to access learning from home if this occurs.

Some parents have expressed that they hold different views to those currently being expressed by the Department and Ministry of Health. At this time I ask for your understanding that the school will follow the highly considered advice of these two decision-making bodies.

My staff and I are working really hard to ensure the best possible outcome for all of our students and parents. Please understand that while you are obviously free to make the decisions related to keeping students home to isolate them from others, teachers will not be able to conduct their scheduled lessons and also act as Distance Education providers for students who are not required to self-isolate.

All major Arts, Sports including PSSA and other events have been temporarily ceased until further notice. We are currently modifying drama and Wakakirri. Thank you for your understanding. I will reassess Term 2 events and communicate this in the coming weeks.

I will keep you informed if there are any changes.



Deputy's Message

Emergency Procedures Drill

Lockdown

Lockdown is used when there is an **immediate threat to the school**, e.g. school intruders, sighting in the area of armed persons or the presence of a dangerous animal in the school grounds. Lockdown secures staff and students in rooms, where everyone must remain until the situation has been declared safe.

At times, it may be necessary to have **students return to** or **remain in class-rooms**, e.g. wet weather, vehicles in playground, serious playground incident.

Lockdown Procedures

Any person noticing potential dangers in/ or around the school should immediately notify the office. If this occurs during breaks in the school day students should approach the teacher(s) on duty, who should then notify the office immediately. The staff and students will be alerted to follow the Emergency Lock -Down Procedure by the sounding of **lockdown bell**.

Yesterday students practiced the drill in class time. We will also practice the procedures for when a lockdown is called during break times. In such situations practiced procedures will facilitate safety and result in calm, confident responses from staff and students.
