Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Where did Term 3 go!

It has been great to have a full term of stability and focus on teaching and learning. The students have made great progress in their literacy and numeracy.

Some school achievements this term have been:

- Each fortnight we have virtual assembly where we celebrate student success.
- ◆ Executive team have had two planning days getting ready for the 2021 – 2024 school plan.
- External Validation: Thank you Mrs Granville for her hard work in gathering evidence to present where TWPS is at using the School Excellence Framework. We look forward to the external validation team zooming us 24 September for these results.
- Professional learning for all staff has continued via zoom with a focus on explicitly and systematically teaching reading K – 6.
- Student reports went home and parent teacher interviews via zoom were a great success. Some teacher's trialled three waylearning conversations with parents, teacher and student. We look forward to extending this strategy.
- Learning overviews for all grades were developed and shared with parents. This snapshot of the big ideas in learning ensure parents are informed of the learning trajectory.
- Instructional Rounds has continued with Berowra PS, Oakhill Drive PS, Normanhurst PS and John Purchase PS due to COVID this has moved online ad lessons pre-recorded and zoom is used to link the network.
- PJ Day: thank to the SRC who raised over \$600.
- Environmental Captains have created some new garden beds at the front of the school and a vertical garden outside the library.
   They have also worked on strategically planning some future sustainable projects.
- Virtual Education Week: a pre-recorded assembly formed part of this special week.
- Leadership Institute: I have been involved in working with aspiring principals to build capacity within the public school sector.
- ◆ The executive team have been working with Dr Simon

Breakspears on agile leadership.

- ◆ Congratulations to Miss Singh who was the successful candidate in gaining permanency at TWPS and receiving her teacher accreditation.
- Year 6 round robin competition is going well three lunches each week. We look forward to seeing who will make the finals!

#### Keeping our children safe

Safety is always a priority at Thornleigh West Public School. Our local Council has shared some new resources, fact sheets that give us all a reminder about good habits when on and around roads.

Today's reminder is around road safety. I do think it's always worth a quick read to see if our habits have shifted and could be safer.



# Keeping your children safe when dropping off and picking up at school

Here are a few things you can do to help keep your children and others safer during drop-off and pick-up times during the school week:

- Make sure your children are fastened in the correct child car seat for their age and size and that it is fitted correctly.
- Stick to the 40km/h speed limit in a school zone and look out for children who may be about.
- Watch for flashing lights on buses. They let you know that there may be children crossing or about to cross the road. A 40km/h limit applies when school bus lights flash.
- Always give way to pedestrians particularly when entering and leaving driveways.
- Always park and turn legally around schools.
   Manoeuvres such as U-turns and three-point turns are dangerous during busy school drop-off and pick-up times.
- Drop your children off and pick them up on the school side of the road in your school's designated drop-off and pick-up area. Never call out to them from across the road – they may run to you without checking for traffic.
- It's safest for children to get out of the car through the Safety Door, away from passing traffic. This is the rear footpath side door of the car.









#### Term 3 has been such a great term of learning for Kindergarten.

Our stories are fabulous, we can spell lots of words and for those tricky words, we streetttcchh out our sounds.









Numbers, weighing objects, working out halves, making 3D objects, adding and subtracting, measuring the capacity of objects - we've done it all this term in maths.












We have been watching the weather - it has been sunny for most of the term.
