Inclusive School Project

At Thornleigh West Public School we pride ourselves on our inclusive school culture. This term we have been selected as one of nine schools in the State to participate in the Inclusive Schools Project.

The research project is looking at the design and physical environment of schools and how they can better support learning and wellbeing outcomes for students with disability. This is a pilot research project as part of the Department's Disability Strategy.

These include surveys, focus groups, and interviews with teachers and parents, plus an observational tool to record specific features of the school.

Parent /Teacher bookings

Each year we value to opportunity to share students learning, progress and next steps with parents and carers through our Parent/ Teacher interviews. In 2019 we trialled a class conducting three way interviews, inclusive of the students, actually led by the student. In 2020 interviews were held via Zoom, a new experience for all at the time. This year we are extending the Three Way Interviews, using the model across a group of students from each stage group. We look forward to sharing this process with you as we refine our reporting model and strive to include greater student voice and develop students as drivers of their learning at Thornleigh West.

The process is established through reflection, conferencing and documenting. We have purposefully aligned the semester two reporting period to coincide with interviews to provide a time to discuss both the growth and also next steps in learning.

Environment News

Composting Workshop

Last week, every class went to a composting workshop.

We learnt all about worms. Did you know there are different types of worms? Composting worms which are smaller and earthworms. Worms are good for composting because they eat the food and scraps. The worms help make perfect fertiliser.

These are some of the things that can go into a compost bin;

- Banana peels
- Apple cores
- The inside of tea bags



This is a list of what is not recommended to put in the compost bins;

- Citrus peels (mandarin, orange, lemon)
- Cheese
- Dairy
- Cake
- Meat (can attract flies and rats)
- Hot chips (the chips can burn the worms' skin, the oil can stop the worms from breathing and the salt is bad for them too)

We played a composting game where we got into teams and had to sort the food, depending on whether it is suitable to go in the composting bin or not.



"I was surprised that you cannot put mandarin peel in the composting bin." - Aabha

" I didn't know you couldn't put onions in the composting bin unless you blend it up with something else so the worms are tricked into eating the onions."- Ellie

"I liked learning about how worms eat and how composting works. I didn't know that worms can travel a long way." Hamish

It is better to compost our food scraps so they do not go to landfill. If you are interested in starting composting at home, there are different types of composting bins to choose from.
