As students return to school please do remember to also return any ICT devices that have been borrowed. Do keep a device if needed at home for the eldest child to return.

Students returning will need to remember their drink bottles and good practices around health and hygiene including:

For Everyone

- Stay at home if unwell Staff and Students are expected to stay away from school if unwell.
- Students should notify their teacher if they become unwell during the day and need to go home.
- Only return to school when fully recovered.
- Wash your hands regularly and thoroughly maintaining good personal hand hygiene is the single most effective way to reduce the risk of transmission.
- Maintain respiratory hygiene cover your cough or sneeze by coughing or sneezing into your elbow or tissue. Dispose of tissues properly and always wash your hands.
- Avoid shaking hands when greeting people.

School Visitor Check-in

A single School Visitor Check-in system for every school across the state is coming from 18 October.

The Department of Education has partnered with Service NSW to provide a streamlined, digital school sign-in system for visitors and contractors at every NSW government school.

Benefits of the new system include:

- Linked to NSW Health's COVID-19 contact tracing ensuring every school is compliant with the NSW <u>COVID-19 mandate</u>.
- Giving every school greater access to streamlined NSW Government services.

Parents and their children may be anxious about the return to school

- As a parent try to not project your fears onto your young person.
- Children learn to manage their emotions via co-regulation. Model the response you wish your child to have.
- Allow your child the opportunity to discuss their fears and concerns. Work on solutions and strategies together.
- Involve your child in preparation the night before school starts laying out uniform, packing bag. Promote a positive mindset.

ROUTINES



Many young people will be out of the school routine. In order to support a smooth transition back to school, we should consider

- bedtimes and waking time. If necessary work towards this gradually over the next 14 days.
- mealtimes, to fit in with the school timetable, snack and lunchtime. Stop excess snacking between meal times.
- Keep to school timings for home learning, particularly in final week.
- Ensure child is supported to manage timetable and equipment, ensure organisation day before to save anxieties on the morning
- Take the walk/journey to school once or twice in the week before.

Medication / Health Care

UPDATE #6 - 11 OCTOBER 2021

As we prepare to welcome students back to the classroom and onto our buses, we would like to take this opportunity to provide a quick update on how we will support this transition over the next few weeks.

From 18 October 2021, we will return to a full timetable, including the resumption of all school services. This will mean that our buses will be ready to support the staggered return to schools.

We can confirm the following safety measures are being followed:

- Our Drivers remain compliant with the Public Health Orders and are committed to supporting the community.
- · Masks remain mandatory for all drivers and increased cleaning regimes will continue.
- Our exclusion zones remain in place on board to help maintain space between our drivers and customers.
- All of our public route services have now been increased to a total customer limit of 27 people. Available seating will continue to be identified by the familiar green dots that say 'sit here'.
- However we can confirm that this limit will not apply to school students and priority will be given to them where possible. We are still bound to ensure no child is left behind. Additional monitoring will be undertaken to address any issues that arise.

In line with Government instruction, we also encourage people to avoid peak hour travel, allow additional travel time or make alternative travel arrangements if possible. Similarly, we ask that parents also consider alternative transport options for their children to ensure they are not impacted by these changes.

Be assured, your students safety and wellbeing is paramount and we look forward to welcome our school communities back on board in the coming weeks.

Primary Ethics News



Ethics teachers needed at Thornleigh West Public School for Kindy 2022

As your child starts Kindergarten at Thornleigh West Public School next year, we would like to let you know about the school's Primary Ethics program.

Primary Ethics was started in 2010 to offer NSW primary school students philosophical ethics as an alternative to attending non-scripture classes. Ethics classes are now offered in 450 schools around the state, all taught by volunteers. Classes teach children logical reasoning and thinking skills and develop their ability to support arguments with evidence. Students learn to disagree respectfully and think about decisions that affect them and people around them. The classes aim to provide an inclusive, secular learning environment and foster a respect for diverse views and ways of thinking among our students.

Some examples of the topic areas covered in kindergarten include:

- Intentions What happens if you hurt someone without meaning to? What happens if you say sorry but there
 are still consequences?
- Telling the truth Should we always tell the truth, or are there times when we shouldn't? What happens when we don't tell the truth?
- Knowledge How do we now what we know? When do you know something and when are you guessing?

We would like to be able to offer ethics classes to families of kindergarten students who request it. To meet demand for ethics classes next year, we need a number of new ethics teachers ready to begin in February 2022. Primary Ethics teachers include school parents, grandparents and local community members. You don't need previous experience teaching or working with children, all ethics teachers are fully trained to deliver the highly structured, age-appropriate Primary Ethics curriculum. The total time commitment is around 45 minutes per week, including a class each Wednesday at 2.15pm and time to read over the lesson in preparation for the class.
